David's Dialogue

Dear members and friends of St. Matthew's,

I lift up my eyes to the hills; from where is my help to come? My help comes from the Lord, the maker of heaven and earth. *Psalm 121*

The psalmist who wrote the 121st Psalm was on an arduous pilgrimage. Their feet were sore; their next resting place was uncertain; their safety was not guaranteed. Perhaps they were at a low point in the journey, geographically and spiritually. Perhaps they were alone. Perhaps they felt they were at the end of their strength. As a result, the psalm begins with a question: "from where is my help to come?"

In illness, in grief, in family ruptures, in poverty, in joblessness, in homelessness, we can feel cut off from what gives us life. Ironically, Christmas time aka "the most wonderful time of the year," can be a time when we feel sadness and loss most keenly. At this time many of us strain our eyes in the gloom asking "from where is my help to come?"

As the psalmist faced the end of hope an answer came to them which took them back to the beginning: "My help comes from YHWH, the maker of heaven and earth." The psalmist remembered the sacred story that teaches that the world has been created with loving intention. A spiritual frame of mind that looks for the good in the world, that expects that justice will be done, that is open to the possibility of beauty as something we all need in times of heartache and suffering. But more than this, the psalmist also recognizes that the Creator is a very present <u>help</u> in their trouble, a personal help! Again, we hear an echo of the creation story: YHWH said, "It is not good that the human should be alone; I will make them a helper as their partner."

The Gospel of Christ is a response to this need. Christmas is about a God who took human form to share our burden. Christmas is about Good Friday not Black Friday, about self-giving not gift-giving, about the Last Supper not turkey supper. Christmas is about Christ. Christ who was born, yes! But also, Christ who died on a cross and rose from the dead to be alive with us forevermore. Christmas time is a time to remember the whole Gospel: God is the Maker of Heaven and Earth, God is our helper. God who names the starry host also calls each of us by name. Jesus who was born in a manger 2000 years ago, comes as a light in our darkness today.

If Christmas is a time of loneliness for you, please remember that the story of the gospel is about a God who sees and cares for the lonely. That is the Good News. So, this Christmas may the blessings of hope, peace, joy and love that we have come to know through Christ be yours in a deep and wonderful way.

Peace like a river.


We received this lovely note from Viola Hodge who asked that it be shared with the Congregation!
